

Wine and Beer Service Policies and Procedures

- All wine must be purchased through Llano Estacado Winery.
- Host may have beer at event – see below for options.
 1. If you hire a TABC permit-holding caterer to bring the beer the caterer is responsible for purchasing, bringing and serving the beer. Caterer is responsible for pulling an Alcohol Catering permit or Type 118 permit prior to the event, and to provide a TABC licensed server. In addition, all clean-up of bottles, cans and kegs must be done by the caterer. This options is the ONLY available option if host is planning on a cash bar.
 2. If you hire a caterer that does not hold a TABC permit then host may purchase beer and the caterer can bring a TABC certified server to serve it. All set up and clean-up must be done by hired server or caterer.
 3. Host may bring beer and be charged \$25 per hour for a TABC certified server chosen by the winery. Only bottles and/or cans for this option.
- If host brings the beer then a cash bar is NOT permitted for beer or wine.
- No hard liquor is allowed on the premises.
- Llano Estacado Winery will provide staff members to handle wine bar service; tableside service should be handled by the caterer.
- No one under the age of 21 will be permitted to consume any alcoholic beverages of any kind, whether or not a parent or legal guardian is present.
- Llano Estacado Winery and its employees reserve the right to I.D. anyone and refuse service to anyone they feel is intoxicated.
- Any beverage not pre-authorized will be confiscated.
- Llano Estacado Winery does NOT provide ice, cups, bottle openers, or keg tap.
- If event is over 50 guests and alcohol is being served then security is required.
- Wine service gratuity is not included in rental price.
